BUYER DECLARATIONS - RECOGNISED WITNESS TYPES

Authorised Witnesses. A (statutory) declaration may be made before a person on the list of authorised witnesses in the Statutory Declarations Regulations 1993:

- 1. a person who is currently licensed or registered under a law of a State or Territory to practise in one of the following occupations:
 - a. Chiropractor
 - b. Dentist
 - c. Legal practitioner
 - d. Medical practitioner
 - e. Nurse
 - f. Optometrist
 - g. Patent attorney
 - h. Pharmacist
 - Physiotherapist
 - Psychologist
 - k. Trade marks attorney
 - I. Veterinary surgeon
- 2. a person who is enrolled on the roll of the Supreme Court of a State or Territory, or the High Court of Australia, as a legal practitioner (however described); or
- 3. a person who is in the following list
 - a. Agent of the Australian Postal Corporation who is in charge of an office supplying postal services to the public
 - b. Australian Consular Officer or Australian Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the Consular Fees Act 1955)
 - c. Bailiff
 - d. Bank officer with 5 or more continuous years of service
 - e. Building society officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
 - Chief executive officer of a Commonwealth court
 - Clerk of a court
 - h. Commissioner for Affidavits
 - Commissioner for Declarations
 - j. Credit union officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
 - c. Employee of the Australian Trade Commission who is:
 - in a country or place outside Australia; and
 - ii. authorised under paragraph 3(d) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
 - exercising his or her function in that place
 - I. Employee of the Commonwealth who is:
 - i. in a country or place outside Australia; and
 - ii. authorised under paragraph 3(c) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
 - iii. exercising his or her function in that place
 - m. Fellow of the National Tax Accountants' Association
 - n. Finance company officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
 - o. Holder of a statutory office not specified in another item in this list
 - p. Judge of a court
 - q. Justice of the Peace
 - r. Magistrate
 - s. Marriage celebrant registered under Subdivision C of Division 1 of Part IV of the Marriage Act 1961
 - t. Master of a court
 - u. Member of Chartered Secretaries Australia
 - v. Member of Engineers Australia, other than at the grade of student
 - w. Member of the Association of Taxation and Management Accountants
 - x. Member of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy
 - y. Member of the Australian Defence Force who is:
 - i. an officer; or
 - ii. a non-commissioned officer within the meaning of the Defence Force Discipline Act 1982 with 5 or more years of continuous service; or
 - iii. a warrant officer within the meaning of that Act
 - z. Member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia, the Australian Society of Certified Practising Accountants or the National Institute of Accountants
 - aa. Member of:
 - i. the Parliament of the Commonwealth; or
 - ii. the Parliament of a State; or
 - iii. a Territory legislature; or
 - iv. a local government authority of a State or Territory
 - bb. Minister of religion registered under Subdivision A of Division 1 of Part IV of the Marriage Act 1961
 - cc. Notary public
 - dd. Permanent employee of the Australian Postal Corporation with 5 or more years of continuous service who is employed in an office supplying postal services to the public
 - ee. Permanent employee of:
 - i. the Commonwealth or a Commonwealth authority; or
 - ii. a State or Territory or a State or Territory authority; or
 - a local government authority;
 - with 5 or more years of continuous service who is not specified in another item in this list
 - ff. Person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the law of the State or Territory in which the declaration is made
 - gg. Police officer
 - hh. Registrar, or Deputy Registrar, of a court
 - ii. Senior Executive Service employee of:
 - i. the Commonwealth or a Commonwealth authority; or
 - a State or Territory or a State or Territory authority
 - jj. Sheriff
 - kk. Sheriff's officer
 - II. Teacher employed on a full-time basis at a school or tertiary education institution.
